INVESTIGATION TOOLS: WHAT INVESTIGATION SOURCES ARE AVAILABLE TO THE OTHER SIDE?

I. INTRODUCTION.

The purpose of this paper is to provide a sampling of public information sources on the Internet that can assist with the investigation, prosecution or defense of trucking-related accidents, whether the case involves personal injury, property damage, or both. The Internet is an information resource bank that can produce an incredible amount of information relatively instantly. A well-prepared plaintiff's lawyer can arrive for the deposition of a company's safety director more familiar with the company's safety and inspection record than the director himself. A diligent defense lawyer can spot potentially prejudicial safety issues in advance to better prepare his client to present for deposition.

Even in the early stages of a dispute, Internet information can prove invaluable. A plaintiff's lawyer can use it to assess the relative strengths and weaknesses in a case before agreeing to representation. Information acquired off the Internet can be used to devise discovery strategies for plaintiff's counsel. Similarly, defense counsel can use the Internet early on to gain a broader understanding of the industry's standards and practices. This is important because it can enable the defense to incorporate elements of public policy into case strategy to help convey to the jury the complexity and responsibility of managing a corporation that can run five million driver miles a year in interstate commerce.

II. WHAT INTERNET SITES ARE AVAILABLE?

The premier site to begin researching a trucking case is the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) web page at <http://www.fmcsa.dot.gov/>. This site (as currently constructed and published) includes links to a wide variety of databases and other sites yielding information of significant value. For example, one can obtain licensing and insurance information on authorized for-hire motor carriers. Such information was long available under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) but, with the Internet, it is instantly available on your computer screen in a printable format.

As a further example, you can discover how much insurance a trucking company carries, what the policy or policies cover, and by whom such policies are underwritten. Since the availability of trucker's insurance can assure the collection of any potential judgment, this information can be of strategic importance.

The FMCSA site also includes information useful for particular inquiries, such as the up-to-date Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR), hazardous materials regulations and various other federal laws affecting or regulating trucking transportation. A regulatory guidance section provides plain-English translations of the official federal regulations that are helpful early on in your search as you try to determine what regulations may apply to a particular situation.

If a case involves drug and alcohol issues, the current regulations governing these problems are listed. By reading through this material, one can determine whether a specific company's substance abuse policies conform to DOT standards. The site also lists carriers who have been taken out of service by the Federal authorities for regulatory violations and failures to pay fines.

The FMCSA site also provides links to several very useful sites, among them the Motor Carrier Analysis and Information on-line site, which can be found at <http://ai.fmcsa.dot.gov/mcsa.asp>. This site contains a motor carrier's "SafeStat" data, along with other useful information, such as the number of fatal accidents a trucking company reported in the past 30 months. The site also contains a carrier's "SafeStat" ranking, which determines the current relative safety status of individual motor carriers in comparison to the industry as a whole. The SafeStat ranking is more oriented to FMCSA regulatory purposes than it is to litigation, in that it may be used by the FMCSA to determine when a trucking company should receive an onsite FMCSA compliance review. The SafeStat score is also a tool used to determine if police authorities will subject a driver and his rig to a random roadside DOT inspection.

The SafeStat information was all available to the public in the past. However, recently the FMSCA has added three levels of security to their SafeStat information: 1) general public, 2) Motor Carriers, and 3) FMCSA and State Enforcement Users. The level of information one can view is now determined by their access privileges. As

noted on the FMSCA login page, Motor Carriers now need their own Personal Identification Number (PIN) provided by FMCSA to access the more detailed data including driver name and license number in the detailed crash and inspection reports. The data for FMSCA and State Enforcement User includes the same information available to Motor Carriers, but also includes FMSCA management reports. However, the access to the public information in SafeStat is still made easy through the FMCSA search on the DOT #, MC # or Carrier Name.

As an example, let's use the SafeStat score for a carrier based in the Northeast. This carrier had a SafeStat score of 398 and an assigned category rating of A. These scores do not mean much until you read in the explanation section that overall SafeStat scores are computed only for carriers with poor safety records so that these carriers can be identified, monitored and prioritized for regulatory compliance reviews. According to SafeStat, this carrier does not have a good safety record.

The overall SafeStat score is a computation based on four safety evaluation areas (SEA): 1) Accident, 2) Driver, 3) Vehicle and 4) Safety Management. The SafeStat screen for this example gives a vehicle inspection score of 77.8 for the carrier, which effectively equates to a recommendation that local police/DOT compliance inspectors should always stop and inspect this carrier's rigs for possible safety violations whenever or wherever they find them.

Doing the same exercise for another carrier from the West Coast turns up a SafeStat score of 363 and a vehicle

inspection score of 94.5. Under the Inspection Selection System, FMCSA recommends that every one of these carrier's rigs also be inspected wherever they can be found. Checking the origin of this recommendation, one can see that 6 of the 12 rigs operated by this carrier had ticketed safety violations in the past 30 months.

Obviously, whether you are defending a trucking company or representing a plaintiff injured in a trucking accident, it is helpful to know whether the FMCSA considers the trucking company to have a poor safety record. As defense counsel, you might not get that admission from the safety director in the pre-deposition meeting; however, as a plaintiff, you should be informed enough to ask about a poor safety record in detail. Additionally, the fact the SafeStat rating recommends a company's trucks be subjected to roadside DOT inspections at every opportunity is also important. It can easily lead to questions as to whether or not an alleged negligent driver's rig was improperly maintained, had deficient equipment, or was not roadworthy at the time of the accident. This fact could also be used in defense to show no new violations even under a more scrutinized level of inspections.

Additional information of interest is also available from the Analysis and Information web site. If you click on other areas, you can learn that the Northeastern carrier had 2 collisions in the last 30 months with no fatalities. Meanwhile, the West Coast carrier had 5 accidents within 3 months causing personal injuries. The detail screen gives the collision location, VIN, and license plate for each collision. A further detail screen gives specifics on each accident, including the investigating police

agency and enough detail to obtain a Police Report for these collisions. For example, one driver for the West Coast carrier caused 5 personal injuries in one collision. In that same 30-month period, the West Coast carrier had 6 serious moving violations. The detail screen reveals that many of these violations were for speeding. Past-recorded violations such as these listed at this location would be useful to the plaintiff or defense if the accident involves allegations of excessive speed.

Another useful web page is the Safety and Fitness Electronic System, or the "Safer System," found at <http://www.safersys.org>. This information site keys to each carrier's DOT number. When entered, the site gives a "carrier snapshot" of a particular trucking company, including such information as addresses, power units, drivers, and types of cargo carried. The snapshot also gives a capsule of inspection history, including a comparison of out-of-service percentages to the national averages. The snapshot gives crash statistics for 24 months and the results of the last compliance review. Insurance information for liability and cargo purposes is also provided.

The primary difference between SafeStat and SAFER is SafeStat provides a data-driven analysis system that determines the current relative safety status of individual motor carriers and SAFER provides concise snapshot of a company's identification information, size, commodity information, and safety record. The systems are conveniently linked so you can get information from both systems easily.

III. INVESTIGATION OF ACCIDENTS IN REAL TIME.


Most newspapers in Texas have websites that are updated several times throughout a given day. See the <http://www.newspaperlinks.com/> site for a national map of newspapers. Clicking on Texas reveals a list of 150 local newspapers across the state with websites, such as the Houston Chronicle's website located at <http://www.houstonchronicle.com/>.

Unfortunately, your ability to search older story archives may be limited because of clunky search engines used on these sites, but it is worth the try. Also, while many newspapers offer free access to their breaking news stories, few offer free access to their archive of older articles.

Other sources to check are news sites for local television stations, particularly those stations with helicopter coverage. Gebbie Press has put together an all-in-one media directory located at <http://www.gebbieinc.com/tvintro.htm>. From this site, you can link to newspapers, TV-Radio stations and some magazines. This specific page provides a search window or clickable browse by state. Simply click on the state in question for a list of all the TV station websites available in the chose state. On this site for Texas, there are links to 91 TV stations websites.

The Houston affiliates of NBC (<http://click2houston.com>), ABC (<http://abclocal.go.com/ktrk>) and CBS (<http://www.khou.com>) each offer breaking news with photographs taken from their helicopter coverage. For example, this photo taken from a helicopter and copied from ABC's website shows a trailer fire in

progress *before* the fire department arrived. The question of whether the fire started in the trailer's refrigeration motor can be addressed by examining this photo, along with statements and other proof, which shows convincingly the fire started in the trailer and then spread to the trailer's refrigeration unit.



Studying the various news sites will also help determine what information regarding the severity of the accident, potential deaths, etc. was leaked to the local jury pool. A particularly severe accident receiving a substantial amount of new coverage insinuating fault for the Defendant may be useful in obtaining a change of venue to a more impartial jurisdiction. Conversely, a review of news sites indicating a particular accident received little local news coverage could help defeat such a motion.

IV. OTHER HELPFUL TRUCKING SITES.

This site gives the Uniform Manual on Traffic Control Devices in .pdf format. This site is useful if a traffic sign or other traffic control device (or its absence) may have played a role in causing the accident. The site provides information pertaining to Federal Regulations, a database to official rulings (currently being updated), and

This is an electronic magazine of news specific to the trucking industry. Also includes information on new products in the trucking industry and industry briefs.

U.S. Investigations Services is a company that provides its customers with valuable pre-employment screening and drug testing information. USIS can supply carriers with a host of products, including employment history files, MVRs, credit reports, criminal reports, employment credit reports, and can even provide total applicant screening through one of its industry partners. USIS also provides social security number verifications and workers compensation or injury reports on potential hires.

A great source of publications and other transportation information, JJ Keller & Company publications are in every good trucking library. The Keller pocket book of federal motor carrier regulations is a classic and frequently handed out in driver orientation programs.

This website provides a searchable database containing regulatory information pertinent to the trucking industry. The page has links to the trucking laws of various states, historical regulatory data and licensing requirements. It is presented in plain English and easily understandable.

This website is a menu driven commerce network site providing information and links on a variety of trucking topics. The site is a compilation site designed to provide a quick way to list other sites with trucking specific information from trucking association websites to truck driver websites to trucking database websites.

The website for the CRASH network, a victim's advocacy group known as "Citizen's for Reliable and Safe Highways". This page contains current regulatory and legislative information, as well as victim testimonials and links to victim's advocacy groups.

This is the Bureau of Transportation website that provides access to more than 100 transportation related databases.

V. INVESTIGATING THE PARTIES.

Below are some useful links for investigating the background of both the Plaintiff and the driver. These links can be of interest in litigating any motor vehicle case and are in no way exhaustive or all-inclusive; there are literally thousands of additional pages of information available. Keep in mind the Internet is only a starting point for your investigation and most information, once located on the Internet,

still has to be independently verified and obtained in an admissible format.

This subscription data website can give reports on criminal convictions, driver's license, department of motor vehicle data, voter registration, federal firearms dealer license data, civil court filings in a few localities, and some professional license data.

<http://www.searchsystems.net/>

Another great public records site which is free is Search Systems. This site is broken into national public records by subject matter such as adoption, census, export control, and vehicle safety. The site also provides easy to follow links broken out by state. The site will also go down to the city, county or regional subdivisions.

Once inside a particular State listing, the site provides a link by subject matter to a specific public record location. In addition, there is a description of the site and a flag as to whether the site is a free site or a pay site. The links are extensive and provide a great source for all types of public records from alcoholic beverage licenses to burials in state cemeteries.

This website is known as the Black Book Online. The site comes complete with a warning the site should only be used by professional investigators, or legal, collection, insurance or law enforcement professionals. This site is good starting point for all types of free information. The website contains links to reverse phone lookups, general phone directories, state records, federal records, maildrops, death records and various other types of information.

Drivers.com has published a page linking to every State's Department of Public Safety or current authority for issuing drivers licenses. This is a good page to start with for finding state specific information and ordering individual specific information. The website for the Texas Department of Public Safety (<http://www.txdps.state.tx.us/>) has links to downloadable forms for Freedom of Information Act requests on motor vehicle operator records and for title information on vehicles. You can also download forms for ordering criminal record searches via mail. Many states have similar web pages for their respective law enforcement agencies with equal or comparable information available.

There are several sites on the web which provide and index to help users find information more easily. Several are devoted to law enforcement. Officer.com has a comprehensive index to the law enforcement agencies websites in each U.S. state, federal, military and worldwide jurisdictions. A similar site at CopSeek.com (<http://www.copseek.com/dsx/search.php?search::cat/category::114/app::hyperseek/>) provides the same type of index information. Lastly, the state troopers also maintain an official directory of state patrol and state police websites for each U.S. state <http://statetroopersdirectory.com/#Menu>. These types of index sites will really cut down on the amount of time necessary to find the specific law enforcement site in a particular state or region.

Department's page features links to pages instructing the user how to make FOIA requests for various investigative materials related to specific criminal incidents or traffic accidents. One can also determine who to contact about such things as obtaining records of 911 calls and records of complaints regarding specific traffic control devices. Many police departments, even in smaller cities, have similar pages.

The Texas Department of Public Safety Criminal Records Database. This is a fee-based service, but it is a superior source of information for criminal history within the State of Texas. It provides enough detailed information to subpoena any located criminal records. This database does not contain information on Class C moving violations. Fees per search are under \$5.00.

Criminalbackground.com provides a basic criminal background check. The page is a good reference for starting a criminal background investigation. If you have good reason to suspect your subject has some type of criminal history and this page fails to find it, then it is advisable to use other means to keep looking. Further, the economy search on this service is limited in the number of state jurisdictions that it covers. Read carefully the limits of whatever search you use.

The Texas Department of Criminal Justice. Through this web page and some phone calls one can determine how to request information about incarcerated offenders, such as dates of incarceration, which is useful to rebut claims of loss of consortium.

Government agencies remain a prime location for finding all sorts of data, regulations, bulletins, or public records. If you know which state department holds the specific data you are looking for; you are 90% of the way there. However, if you only have an idea of where to look, there are many general index sites that will provide extremely useful in your hunt for information.

For example, State and Local Government on the Net is a site devoted to the easy access to any state or local government entity website. At the time of this writing there were 9,757 government websites located on this site. This is a quick way to find government websites in any state of interest. Simply click on the state in question and an easy to follow State site is provided. The site lists the government agencies by statewide offices, legislative branch, judicial branch, executive branch, boards and commissions, regional, county, city, town, village, other and libraries.

If you are looking for a particular state's secretary of state or controller of public account website, this index listing makes it two clicks away.

If you already know what state agency you need and that agency is specific to your practice, no doubt there is an index page already created for that particular subject matter.

For example, the National Association of Development Organizations has created a resource link page providing an index of all State Departments of Transportation. This is particularly useful when you are a national carrier and want to find some specific information about a particular state and you

already know the Department of Transportation has the appropriate jurisdiction. This site also provides links to Federal Agencies, Foundations, etc....

The Texas Department of Transportation maintains an excellent page for investigating motor carriers permitted out of Texas and for investigating roadway conditions existent at the time of the accident. Check out their "One Stop Shop for Motor Carriers" for basic safety and registration information. Another useful item on this page is a directory of TXDOT personnel by district and a map of district boundaries. If you have a specific question about roadway signage, construction or maintenance activities at the time of an accident you can usually locate on this page the appropriate regional personnel to contact about it.

The National Highway Safety and Transportation Administration website is a good source of information if, for example, you want to find out why the plaintiff's car rolled over for no apparent reason. You can start your search here with detailed statistics on vehicular safety ratings and accidents. This site also provides links to recall information for particular vehicles, performance ratings and tips for injury prevention.

In most States, the Secretary of State website will allow you to find out if the defendant is properly incorporated and in good standing. For example, the Texas Secretary of State provides the online service for a modest fee but a telephone number on their page allows free access. Be

advised if you have reason to disagree with the online information you may want to make a follow up telephone call because in some instances the online information may not be the most current.

Most states' Secretaries of State web pages contain corporate information. This can be useful for determining agents of service, contact information, years of incorporation and standing. An alternative source for company information in Texas is the Texas Comptroller's Office website:

This site allows you to search for companies doing business in the state by name, partial name, file number or tax identification number. Some records include company directors, agents for service of process and current standing. While not as exhaustive as the Secretary of State site, information at this site is provided free of charge.

The Harris County Clerk offers a web page featuring free services. Using this page you locate d/b/a filings, property records, medical liens, UCC filings, marriage licenses and other public filings made with the clerk. This page also has docket information on the county courts at law. It is a good page for finding liens outstanding against the plaintiff or defendant and finding other county court litigation the plaintiff or Defendant may be involved in. However, the information available on this page is not particularly in depth. For example, it may report the existence of a hospital lien and the date the lien was filed, but not the amount of the lien. Nevertheless, it is still a good starting point to find certain county records that contain information about your subject.

The Harris County Judicial Information Management Service. If your subject lives in Harris County, this page will allow you to discover his entire Harris County criminal history in detail. Further, you can index his name through civil filings and determine what civil cases he has been connected with as either a party or a witness. Finally, you can research opposing counsel, locating all cases on which he is an attorney of record and how many and what types of cases he has handled.

You can also get up to the minute docket information on your case and verify that pleadings have been filed and hearings have been set (this of course is subject to occasional data entry errors so if something seems wrong it should be double-checked). This page is a fee-based service and getting online requires a deposit. Once you are familiar with this page you will find it the starting point for investigative work in Harris County. This page only contains court information for district and county courts in Harris County, Texas.

This web page contains all current Texas statutes online. Although this page really has nothing to do with background investigations, it is a useful and free service. The database is not searchable but instead features an interactive table of contents.

The PACER Service Center is the federal judiciary's centralized registration, billing, and technical support center for electronic access to U.S. district, bankruptcy, and appellate court records. Civil or criminal, if your subject has problems in federal court you should check

here first. This is a fee-based service.

Like most other topics discussed, if your practice is national and you need an easy way to move from jurisdiction to jurisdiction for similar information. Rest assured, there is an index page to help. The Law Library Resource Exchange is an index site providing both state and federal court forms, court rules and docket information. The site contains some 1,400 sources for state and federal court rules, forms and dockets.

If your need is simply a particular courts form, then U.S. Court Forms has the site you need. U.S. Court Forms has over 60,000 court forms organized by state and federal jurisdictions. The forms are presented by subject matter and are free to download in .pdf format. If you need other formats, they provide a subscription services to get access to the other formats. However, suppose you need a form for the American Arbitration Association, simply select federal and click on American Arbitration directory tree. Likewise, if you need a particular state form, just click on the state and select the appropriate, statewide, local county, court of appeals, or other jurisdiction.

National Climatic Data Center. Need to find out what the climatic conditions were at the time of the accident? Check this page. The world's largest archive of weather data, NCDC can provide you weather data in a format admissible under Federal rules.

County of Emergency Management websites. The Harris County Office of Emergency Management maintains an extensive series of rain gauges in bayou basins in relation to its flood control program. Rain in inches by gauge can be found on this page and more likely than not in Harris County there will be a gauge within a couple miles of your accident scene and the rainfall data for the day of the accident can be subpoenaed. Other counties may have similar pages.

VI. PEOPLE FINDERS: FINDING THE LOST WITNESS.

The Internet also features numerous pages to assist you in locating lost witnesses. Online telephone and address databases should not take the place of a phone call to directory assistance because the online data is not always complete or current. Further, if an individual's phone number is not listed in information, it probably will not be available here.

The WhitePages.com Network offers a free and relatively reliable way to identify personal and business contact information. With over 6.5 million monthly unique users, the WhitePages.com Network is the second most trafficked independent White Pages site on the Internet. This site provides reverse phone number and reverse address lookup free of charge.

This page allows you to reverse look up people with a phone number and address. It also contains other search engines for companies and miscellaneous information.

A service operated by Lycos with links to public record databases.

A service operated by AT&T. This page also features reverse look up, yellow pages and business pages.

Similar to your paper yellow pages at home, this site provides a search listing of businesses by category or name nationwide.

This site provides a reverse lookup search by phone number, by area code or zip code. This site is also setup for both persons or business and can provide a map and directions if needed.

VII. THE GENERAL SEARCH: WHERE DO I LOOK FOR THAT?

At some point, you will have to look for information on a specific detail for which little general information is available. You have already checked the plaintiff, the driver and the company through all the available databases and have a fair idea of the past behavior and credibility of each. Now you must look for resources on a particular topic so customized that you are not even sure how to start. Maybe you need an expert in a particular isolated discipline or maybe you need a publication that backs up what you believe is the appropriate standard of care in the face of a negligence allegation. Whatever it is, the Internet as a whole may be a place to start looking.

Example: A truck driver and his

company are involved in a wrongful death case. Two trailer tires came off the rig at highway speed because all 10 lug nuts on one trailer axle fell off. The trailer recently had new rubber installed and your suspicion is that the tire shop failed to tighten the lug nuts, leaving them loose enough to fall off the wheel. However, the driver reports that he did his usual pre-trip inspection and saw nothing wrong, but he did also not put his fingers on the lug nuts to see if they were tight. Your question is whether a driver doing a pre-trip inspection must actually touch the trailer lug nuts and give them a trial turn with his fingers to determine if they are loose.

For this search, use a general search engine like Google.com and enter the search terms "pre-trip inspection" & "lug nuts". The result is 96 sites using these two terms. The first likely candidate is the Oregon Trucking Association website, which includes suggested pre-trip inspection. The site only says to check the wheels for lug nut tightness and cracks. The next site is the Wyoming DOT site that includes a 15-page .PDF format document on doing pre-trip inspections. The section on lug nuts and wheels says to check the number of lug nuts present, whether they are free of distortions and show signs of looseness, such as rust trails. It says nothing about physically touching the lug nut. Another site that turned up is a product manufacturer site for a device that detects loosening lug nuts. This site states that a hand torque wrench should be used so as to make sure the nuts are not over-tightened. Nice, but that's not our problem.

One site gives a pre-trip inspection

guideline from Utility & Telecom fleets Magazine. This page reports that rust trails leading from wheel studs indicates loose lug nuts. The page also identifies the author who might be a potential expert. The web page for the Florida Department of Highway Safety Motor Vehicles includes their license book, which says to look for rust trails and, after a tire has been changed, stop a short distance after the tire change and recheck tightness of nuts. On the other hand, the Missouri and Michigan Commercial Drivers License manuals only say to do a visual inspection of lug nuts. A research pass using "loose lug nuts" netted some stories about NASCAR's problems with loose lug nuts but no trucking related information.

Another way to start the search is to enter one term and see how many sites are found, then add more specific terms until the number looks searchable. Starting with "lug nuts" nets 39,000 sites, but adding the term "18 wheeler" reduces that amount to 30 sites, easily searchable, but none give any useful information. Re-doing the search with "truck" gives 106 sites, some of which look interesting to open and read. Several pages come close enough to help, including one by a "tire doctor," who discusses the effects of torque on tires.

VIII. LEXIS NEXIS SEARCHING.

The best subscription site by far that we have ever found is LexisNexis. Most attorneys are already familiar with this site as a resource for obtaining and updating statutes, case law and secondary sources pertaining to the law, such as law review articles. However, LexisNexis also offers a wealth of investigative resources as well.

Although this is a relatively expensive subscription service, the database available for searching is extensive. The advertising materials cite to 1.9 billion individual and business records drawn from 1,100 sources. Using LexisNexis, record searches can be done for persons and business locators, real property records, personal property records, business incorporation information, judgments and liens, civil and criminal court filings, verdicts and settlements and any licenses held by the search subject.

In a recent demonstration of this service, the database was capable of pulling up current and old addresses for any given subject, the current and past neighbors up and down the street where the subject lived (in case you want to call neighbors and ask about the subject), bankruptcy court filings, past arrests, marriages and divorces, fictitious business names, boat registrations, professional licenses, and a host of other information. The database also has access to local demographic data, allowing a fair determination of whether the quality of local juries will be a factor in a pre-trial analysis. A search can be made for plaintiff and defense attorneys by name and see their win-loss records with similar cases and the dollar amount of their verdicts. You can also determine the dollar amount of verdicts in the past from a given injury, which is helpful in setting reserves.

For database searches of a given individual, the LexisNexis service might well be considered the ultimate in information finding ability. In fact, you may have paid private investigators for this same information in the past. The additional information beyond merely finding the people information available in LexisNexis will start out being frosting on the cake, but,

as we have found out, the additional information will prove more and more useful over time.

Welcome !

The Harris County Clerk's office is a State Constitutional office, with the duties of County Clerk varying somewhat in each of our 254 counties.

In Harris County the County Clerk wears three hats. As clerk she maintains the records of Commissioners' Court, Probate Courts and County Civil Courts at Law. As a recorder she is responsible for real property records including state and federal tax liens; vital statistics records including marriage licenses; assumed names and uniform commercial code records, and various other records including military discharge records, hospital liens and livestock brands.


As chief election official for the third largest county in the country, she administers county and state elections and also contracts for election services for political parties and smaller jurisdictions.

The current County Clerk, Beverly Kaufman, was appointed to the office on March 11, 1994 and was elected to a full four-year term in November 1994 by 61.3% of the vote countywide and re-elected in 1998 and 2002. She employs 301 regular employees, with 400 temporary employees for elections. Her annual budget is approximately \$20 million and she collects revenues through fees for numerous services provided. Mrs. Kaufman is also responsible for registry accounts created by probate and county court orders. Current total registry accounts average \$70 million but have been known to reach the \$100 million level during peak county condemnation periods for infrastructure expansion, such as the Harris County Toll Roads.

The Harris County Clerk's Main Office is located in the Harris County Administration Building at 1001 Preston, on the 4th floor.




